Use of Sports Premium Funding for the 2017/2018 Academic Year

Action/Resources	Cost	Anticipated Impact
LiveWire Membership	£1,700	LiveWire is extremely supportive of children being active and healthy throughout Warrington, and recognise this is a particularly significant time for PE and School Sport especially within Primary schools. LiveWire provide schools with a range of services including staff training and CPD, quality assured coaches who can work alongside school staff and at afterschool clubs as well as delivery of various sports competitions. Following our registration in 2017, we will receive a discount on future purchases, for instance Real Gym resources and Change4Life training.
KS2 Outdoor Adventurous Activity (OAA)	£1000	Josh Jenner Orienteering provides children with high quality opportunities for children to take part in outdoor and adventurous activity, working individually and as a team. Orienteering offers children the opportunity to develop map and compass skills, to solve navigational problems and provides cross curricular learning as children apply skills from Geography, Mathematics and PE. The quoted amount includes the cost of Josh surveying the school grounds, designing an orienteering map (accompanied with lesson plans, games and activities) and permanent plaques across the school grounds.
Apprentice (contribution to overall costs)	£6000	Barrow Hall are contributing a percentage of Sports Premium funding to the cost of our apprentice. The apprentice is tasked with supporting PE lessons for KS2, where he is responsible for ensuring high standards of teaching and learning are maintained. Further to this, he is involved in finding suitable competitions and festivals for children to take part in and attends these events, alongside another member of staff, representing the school and ensuring high standards of behaviour at these events. Our apprentice is charged with providing structured play opportunities at play and lunch times for children in KS2 to ensure high standards of behaviour at these times, and encouraging children to be physically active at various times of the day
Warrington Wolves	Free	Warrington Wolves Charitable Foundation provide children in Years 3 and 4 with specialist rugby coaching for a half term. In addition to children receiving high quality coaching, teachers also receive CPD. The sessions delivered will be planned in accordance to National Curriculum requirements to ensure children develop, and apply, a broad range of skills with increasing competence, to ensure that they are physically active for a sustained period of time and that they receive the opportunity to participate in competitive sport.
PE Equipment, eg basketball hoops, medicine balls, cones etc.	£500	Further investment in to PE and sports equipment and fixed furnishings will provide children with resources to enhance their PE lessons. Equipment such as cones, medicine balls and hockey sticks will be purchased to ensure children are provided with relevant equipment to further develop their skills. Additionally, larger equipment such as basketball hoops will provide more structured opportunities during play and lunch times.

PE SLE (Specialist Leader of Education)	£6000	To further enhance the quality of PE lessons at Barrow Hall, we have requested the support of Claire Whitaker, a PE SLE, to work alongside teachers throughout the school. Claire will work to ensure high standards are expected and maintained throughout PE lessons and that all groups of children continue to make good progress in their PE lessons as they advance through school.
Football - FA Skills	Free	The FA provides a skills programme, planned in line with National Curriculum requirements and delivered by fully qualified coaches, aimed at developing practical football skills with children aged 5-11 whilst also providing CPD opportunities for class teachers. At the end of this program teachers are provided with the resources, allowing them to continue providing high quality football opportunities after the coaches have left.
Subject Leadership	£600	The PE Leader(s) require one day per term for monitoring and evaluation of PE throughout the school. This time will be used for lesson drop-in and to gather evidence to highlight good progress being made by all groups of children.
Competitions School Games Mark	Free	The Warrington School Sports Partnership allows each school in Warrington to access the School Games government initiative. This provides schools with an entitlement to access the government's School Games initiative through Competition, Young Leadership opportunities, Club Outlets and Change4Life clubs.
Striker Academy - Reach for the Stars Play Leader Training & CPD	£5000	Reach for the stars provide a sustainable programme guiding children towards a role of "Play Leader". Training is delivered to children in Year 6, alongside our Sports Apprentice, and encourages the children to lead activities and games during play times and lunchtimes. This will encourage more structured activity on the playground and will further improve children's behaviour during lunch and play times.

In addition, the school will be investing £20000 on development of the school playgrounds. This will include:
